# Science Element



A frog life cycle has several stages: egg, tadpole, tadpole with legs, froglet, and adult frog.

Frogs begin in water.

As they grow, they change body shape, grow legs, develop lungs, and lose their tail.

This major body change is called metamorphosis.

Simple idea: a frog does not stay the same as it grows up.

It changes stage by stage until it becomes an adult frog.
